- Loves of Leaves Photopolymer Stamp Set \& Stitched Leaves Dies (13 dies)
- Gilded Autumn Specialty Designer Series Paper - \#153520 - \$15.00
- Poinsettia Petals Bundle - \#155148 - \$56.50
- Poinsettia Petals Photopolymer Stamp Set \& coordinating Poinsettia Dies (18 dies)
- Poinsettia Place 12" x 12" Designer Series Paper - \#153487-\$11.50
- Brushed Metallic 12" x 12" Cardstock - \#153524-\$15.00 (2 each of 3 colors)


## Love of Leaves Shaker Card(top left):

- Cajun Craze card stock card base - $51 / 2 \prime \times 81 / 2 \prime$ ", scored at $41 / 4 \prime$
- Gilded Autumn DSP - 4" $\times 51 / 4^{\prime \prime}$; adhered directly to the card base
- Cajun Craze card stock-3 $1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 43 / 4^{\prime \prime}$.
- Stamp greeting on bottom right corner
- Die cut the leaf of your choice
- Add a piece of Window Sheet (\#142314-\$5) cut big enough to cover the opening made from the die cut on the back of the card stock, I like to use Tear \& Tape (\#138995-\$7). The Leaf dies leave a nice stitched image around the opening
- Add foam adhesive strips to the back of the Cajun Craze to create the well to hold sequins as well as around the edges of the piece for stability.
- Do a dry fit of the Cajun Craze to the DSP to see where the window will be, add sequins in a thin pile to the DSP
- Adhere Cajun Craze piece down creating the "Shaker"
- I have used a combination of the Sequins for Everything (\#153556- \$12 \& sequins from my personal stash)
- Add small bow made from the Basket Weave \& Metallic Combo Pack, \#153553 - \$8, to complete the card
- Add a piece of Very Vanilla card stock $4 " \times 51 / 4 \prime$ to the inside stamped with images from the stamp set.


## Colored Leaves Card (top right):

- Whisper White card stock card base - $51 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 8 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime}$, scored at $41 / 4^{\prime \prime}$
- Rich Razzleberry card stock $4 \prime \times 51 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ for the mat
- Whisper White card stock $37 / 8^{\prime \prime} \times 51 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ for stamping
- Randomly stamp images from the stamp set, colors I have used include:
- Rich Razzleberry
- Cinnamon Cider
- BumbleBee
- Pumpkin Pie
- Poppy Parade
- Granny Apple Green (not on pictured card)
- Piece of Rich Razzleberry is used for the banner on the card front ( $1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ wide)
- Whisper White strip is stamped with greeting then hand cut to the size desired.
- The fun part about this card is any color combination you like would look good; the possibilities are endless! Just use a coordinating color for the mat.


## Poinsettia Slimline card (bottom):

- Thick Very Vanilla card base $-8 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime} \times 7$ ", scored at $31 / 2^{\prime \prime}$
- Soft Suede card stock mat - $31 / 4^{\prime \prime} \times 8 \frac{1}{4} 4^{\prime \prime}$
- Designer Series Paper $-3^{\prime \prime} \times 8^{\prime \prime}$
- Poinsettia are die cut using the outline and inside emboss piece on Brushed Metallic cardstock, any of the colors work nicely, layer with Stampin' Dimensionals when adhering to card front
- Greeting stamped in Soft Suede ink on 1" Very Vanilla banner
- Inside in stamped with another greeting the branches in Soft Suede \& So Saffron ink
- I use a standard long envelope for mailing
